Summary (as of Jul 30, 2021)

Taiwan Interparliamentary Group Establishment and Relations Act or the TIGER Act

This bill establishes a group consisting of Members of the Senate and the House of Representatives to meet annually with representatives from Taiwan's parliament to discuss areas of mutual interest between the United States and Taiwan. It also repeals a provision providing for a group of Senators to meet annually with representatives from China's National People's Congress to discuss issues of common interest involving the United States and China.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 30, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 30, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jul 30, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
