Summary (as of Jan 28, 2021)

National Multimodal Freight Network Improvement Act

This bill revises the network components of the National Multimodal Freight Network (NMFN).

Specifically, the bill requires

- the interim NMFN to include public ports of the United States that have a total annual cargo value of at least \$1 billion, and
- the final NMFN to include all specified interim network components when the Department of Transportation designates or redesignates the network.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 4, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **Jan 28, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 28, 2021:** Referred to the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
