Summary (as of Sep 17, 2021)

Energy Accountability Act

This bill prohibits the Department of Energy (DOE) from making a loan guarantee for any entity that previously defaulted on an obligation under title XVII of the Energy Policy Act of 2005. Under that title, DOE must make loan guarantees for innovative energy technologies, such as technologies to reduce or sequester greenhouse gases.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 20, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy.
- **Sep 17, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 17, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Sep 17, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy.
