DHS Roles and Responsibilities in Cyber Space Act

This bill requires the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to report on its roles and responsibilities, as well as those of its components, for responding to cyber incidents. DHS must coordinate with the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency on the report.

Actions Timeline

- **May 17, 2022:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
- **May 16, 2022:** Mr. Malinowski moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended.
- **May 16, 2022:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H4989-4990)
- **May 16, 2022:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 5658.
- **May 16, 2022:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
