### Summary (as of Oct 22, 2021)

#### Promoting Reentry through Education in Prisons Act of 2021 or the PREP Act

This bill establishes, within the Bureau of Prisons, an Office of Prison Education. The office must provide educational services to incarcerated individuals in federal prisons and correctional institutions.

- **Nov 2, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity.
- **Oct 22, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 22, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
