Make in America to Sell in America Act of 2021

This bill requires certain actions to identify critical goods and establish minimum domestic content requirements.

Specifically, the bill directs the Department of Commerce to publish an annual report that identifies finished and intermediate goods that are critical for U.S. national security or the protection of the industrial base.

Additionally, the bill establishes a minimum domestic content requirement for those covered goods identified in Commerce's report. A covered good may not be introduced for sale in the United States unless the domestic value content of the good is more than 50%, with limited exceptions. The President may waive this requirement under specified circumstances.

Further, the bill establishes enforcement provisions, including civil penalties and investigations by the U.S. International Trade Commission.

Actions Timeline

- **Nov 18, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce.
- **Nov 17, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 17, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Nov 17, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
