Summary (as of Jan 28, 2021)

State National Forest Management Act of 2021

This bill directs the Forest Service to convey to a state up to 2 million acres of eligible portions of the National Forest System (NFS) the state elects to acquire through enactment of a law meeting certain criteria.

Portions of the NFS conveyed to a state shall be administered and managed primarily for timber production.

The bill sets forth conditions on changing the management of young-growth stands.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 24, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **Feb 22, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands.
- **Jan 28, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 28, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
