No Mandates for Healthcare Workers Act

This bill prohibits the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) from requiring any drug or vaccine or other biological product to be administered to employees of health care providers as a condition of Medicare and Medicaid participation.

On November 5, 2021, the CMS issued a rule titled *Medicare and Medicaid Programs; Omnibus COVID-19 Health Care Staff Vaccination*. The rule requires health care providers, as a condition of Medicare and Medicaid participation, to ensure that staff are fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 19, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jan 18, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 18, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jan 18, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
