Summary (as of Feb 9, 2022)

No Propaganda Act

This bill prohibits federal funding of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. The bill also rescinds unobligated funding made available to the corporation in specified appropriations acts. (The corporation is a congressionally created nonprofit that supports local public television and radio broadcasting.)

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 10, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Communications and Technology.
- **Feb 9, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 9, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Appropriations, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
