## **School Resource Officer Act of 2022**

This bill reauthorizes through FY2026 the Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) program and otherwise revises the program.

Specifically, the bill revises the COPS program by

- restoring authority to make COPS grants for hiring and rehiring additional career law enforcement officers,
- allowing the federal cost share to be 75% for the duration of such grants, and
- specifying that at least 30% of the amount made available for such grants must be used for school resource officers.

## **Actions Timeline**

---

- **Nov 1, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Feb 11, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 11, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
