### Summary (as of Feb 18, 2022)

#### Arlington Cemetery Marker Fairness Act

This bill requires that headstones other than standard white uniform military grave markers be permitted in certain sections of Arlington National Cemetery. The bill places limits on certain aspects of the headstones, including limitations on size.

## **Actions Timeline**

- **Mar 28, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs.
- **Feb 18, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 18, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Armed Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
