Freedom to Fly Maskless Act of 2022

This bill restricts the authority of the Department of Health and Human Services and the Federal Aviation Administration to issue regulations or safety standards that apply to interstate travelers for preventing the spread of communicable diseases. Specifically, the bill prohibits regulations or safety standards that require an interstate traveler to (1) undergo screening, testing, or treatment (e.g., vaccination); (2) quarantine or isolate; or (3) wear a face covering.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 28, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Aviation.
- **Feb 28, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Feb 25, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 25, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
