Gateway Solidarity Act

This bill authorizes the illumination of the Gateway Arch in St. Louis, Missouri, by blue and yellow lights to show support and solidarity with the Ukrainian people

- in 2022, within 15 days following enactment of this bill, for no fewer than 5 consecutive days; and
- annually on August 24, in recognition of Ukrainian Independence Day, until the President reports to Congress that the Russian government has ceased its destabilizing activities with respect to the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Ukraine.

- **Jul 18, 2022:** Mr. Huffman moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended.
- **Jul 18, 2022:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H6695-6696; text: CR H6695)
- **Jul 18, 2022:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 7002.
- **Jul 18, 2022:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
