COVID Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2022

This bill provides FY2022 supplemental appropriations to several federal departments and agencies for programs and activities to respond to COVID-19.

Specifically, the bill provides appropriations to

- the Department of Health and Human Services,
- the Department of State,
- the U.S. Agency for International Development, and
- the President.

The bill also rescinds specified unobligated funds from several accounts.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 9, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 9, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Appropriations, and in addition to the Committee on the Budget, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Mar 9, 2022:** Rules Committee Resolution H. Res. 973 Reported to House. Rule provides for consideration of H.J. Res. 75, H.R. 6968 and H.R. 7007. The rule provides for consideration of the Senate amendment to H.R. 2471. The rule provides for one of hour of general debate each on the Senate amendment to H.R. 2471, H.J. Res. 75, H.R. 6968, and H.R. 7007. The rule provides for division of the question in relation to the Senate amendment to H.R. 2471.
- **Mar 9, 2022:** Rule H. Res. 973 passed House.
