### No Alternatives to Detention for Illegals Act of 2022

This bill prohibits the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) from enacting any program that provides alternatives to detention for a non-U.S. national (*alien* under federal law) who is in DHS custody and housed at an immigration detention center.
