The resolution recognizes the scientific, engineering, and analytical expertise of the U.S. Geological Survey, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), and the advisory Landsat Science Team.

The resolution also recognizes the important contributions that data produced by the Landsat program provides to decision-makers worldwide.

Finally, the resolution designates July 23, 2022, as Landsat 50th Anniversary Day, or Landsaturday.
