Summary (as of Mar 24, 2022)

Disability ID Act of 2022

This bill requires the Department of Transportation (DOT) to establish a competitive grant program for states and tribal governments to implement programs that allow individuals with disabilities to have discrete disability identifier symbols placed on their state-issued identification cards.

DOT may not award a grant to a state or tribal government that exceeds \$200,000.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 25, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **Mar 24, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 24, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
