Summary (as of Oct 21, 2021)

This resolution sets forth the rule for consideration of (1) H.Rept. 117-152 from the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol, and (2) the accompanying resolution that finds Stephen K. Bannon in contempt of Congress for failing to comply with a congressional subpoena.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 21, 2021:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H5738-5748)
- **Oct 21, 2021:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 727.
- **Oct 21, 2021:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 221 - 206 (Roll no. 327). (consideration: CR H5746)
- **Oct 21, 2021:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 221 - 205 (Roll no. 328).(text: CR H5738)
- **Oct 21, 2021:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 221 - 205 (Roll no. 328). (text: CR H5738)
- **Oct 21, 2021:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Oct 20, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 20, 2021:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 117-153, by Mr. McGovern.
- **Oct 20, 2021:** Provides that if House Report 117-152 is called up by direction of the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol: (a) all points of order against the report are waived and the report shall be considered as read; and an accompanying resolution offered by the direction of the Select Committee shall be considered as read and shall not be subject to a point of order. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on such resolution to adoption without intervening motion or demand for division of the question except one
- **Oct 20, 2021:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 40.
