## Summary (as of Mar 30, 2022)

### American Beef Labeling Act of 2022

This bill reinstates mandatory country-of-origin labeling requirements for beef.

Specifically, the bill requires the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) to develop a means of reinstating the requirements that complies with the rules of the World Trade Organization. The USTR and the Department of Agriculture must implement the means within one year.

## **Actions Timeline**

---

- **Apr 18, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Livestock and Foreign Agriculture.
- **Mar 30, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 30, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Agriculture, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
