Summary (as of Apr 5, 2022)

Supportive Services Enhancement Act

This bill expands the definition of supportive services under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act to include mental health care, substance use disorder treatment, and affordable internet connection. It also requires local one-stop centers to provide such services to adults and dislocated workers.
