### Summary (as of May 18, 2022)

#### Infant Formula Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2022

This bill provides \$28 million in emergency supplemental appropriations to address the shortage of infant formula in the United States.

Specifically, the bill provides appropriations for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to (1) address the current shortage of FDA-regulated infant formula and certain medical foods in the United States; and (2) prevent future shortages, including by taking the steps that are necessary to prevent fraudulent products from entering the U.S. market.

- **May 18, 2022:** Considered under the provisions of rule H. Res. 1124. (consideration: CR H5158-5163)
- **May 18, 2022:** Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 350, H.R. 7688 and H.R. 7790. Provides for one of hour of general debate and one motion to recommit for each bill. Resolution also provides for en bloc suspension authority.
- **May 18, 2022:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H.R. 7790.
- **May 18, 2022:** The previous question was ordered pursuant to the rule.
- **May 18, 2022:** Mrs. Hinson moved to recommit to the Committee on Appropriations. (text: CR H5163)
