### Summary (as of May 17, 2022)

This bill suspends for 90 days the imposition of duties on the importation of any infant formula product. It also directs the Government Accountability Office to study the feasibility of infant formula distribution centers remaining open for 24 hours a day.

### Actions Timeline

- **May 17, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **May 17, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **May 17, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
