Summary (as of Jun 13, 2022)

Nonprofit and School Security Grant Program Act

This bill reauthorizes through FY2027 and expands the Nonprofit Security Grant Program. Under this program, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) makes grants to eligible nonprofit organizations (tax-exempt organizations and those determined to be at risk of a terrorist attack) for target hardening and other security enhancements to protect against terrorist attacks.

In particular, the bill makes elementary, secondary, private, and religious schools eligible for grants under the program.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 14, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Emergency Preparedness, Response, and Recovery.
- **Jun 13, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 13, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
