### Summary (as of May 12, 2021)

This bill directs the Department of the Interior to conduct a study on feasibility of designating as a national historic trail the Chief Standing Bear Trail extending 550 miles from Niobrara, Nebraska, to Ponca City, Oklahoma, which follows the route taken by Chief Standing Bear and the Ponca people during federal Indian removal, and 550 miles from Ponca City through Omaha to Niobrara, Nebraska, which follows the return route taken by Chief Standing Bear and the Ponca people.

## Actions Timeline

- **May 12, 2021:** Mr. Soto moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.

- **May 12, 2021:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 810.
- **May 12, 2021:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
- **May 12, 2021:** Pursuant to the provisions of H. Res. 380, proceedings on H.R. 810 are considered vacated.
