Flores Settlement Update and Establishment Act of 2022

This bill modifies and provides statutory authority for certain policies pertaining to the treatment of minors without lawful immigration status under the *Flores* settlement and revises certain human trafficking laws.

For example, the bill requires each member of a family unit seeking asylum to take a DNA test to verify familial relationships within 72 hours of the family encountering U.S. Customs and Border Protection.

- **Nov 1, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.
- **Jul 13, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 13, 2022:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
