- **Dec 7, 2021:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H6920-6927)
- **Dec 7, 2021:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 838.
- **Dec 7, 2021:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 838, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Cole demanded the yeas and nays, and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question on ordering the previous question until a time to be announced.
