This resolution provides for the consideration of a report from the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol that recommends Mark Meadows be cited for contempt of Congress.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 14, 2021:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H7645-7653)
- **Dec 14, 2021:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 848.
- **Dec 14, 2021:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 117-217, by Mr. Raskin.
- **Dec 14, 2021:** Providing for consideration relating to a resolution to accompany House Report 117-216.
- **Dec 14, 2021:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 57.
- **Dec 14, 2021:** DEBATE - The House continued with further debate on H. Res. 848.
- **Dec 14, 2021:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 848, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the noes had prevailed. Mr. Raskin demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until a time to be announced.
