### Summary (as of Mar 18, 2021)

#### National Women's Hall of Fame Commemorative Coin Act of 2021

This bill directs the Department of the Treasury to mint and issue \$5 gold coins, \$1 silver coins, half-dollar clad coins, and proof silver \$1 coins in recognition and celebration of the National Women's Hall of Fame in Seneca Falls, New York.

All minted coins shall include a specified surcharge, which shall be paid to the National Women's Hall of Fame Foundation to establish an endowment fund to provide for the long-term financing of the hall's operations.
