## **Terrorist Reporting Act of 2022**

This bill requires the Department of Homeland Security to periodically report to Congress information about any non-U.S. nationals (*aliens* under federal law) who (1) were apprehended by the U.S. Border Patrol after unlawfully crossing the border, and (2) appear in the terrorist screening database maintained by the Terrorist Screening Center.

### **Actions Timeline**

---

- **Nov 1, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.
- **Aug 13, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border Security, Facilitation, and Operations.
- **Aug 12, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Aug 12, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
