## **Tracking and Reporting Absent Community-Members Everywhere Act or the TRACE Act**

This bill requires the National Institute of Justice to include additional data categories in the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs), including information about persons who go missing on federal land. It also requires the Departments of Agriculture, Interior, and Defense to report existing missing persons cases on their federal land to NamUs.

### **Actions Timeline**

- **Nov 1, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Oct 4, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **Sep 16, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.
- **Sep 15, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 15, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
