Ukraine Human Rights Policy Act of 2022

This bill provides for congressional oversight of sanctions on foreign persons associated with human rights abuses in territory controlled by Russia and requires reports on human rights abuses related to Ukraine.

## Actions Timeline

---

- **Nov 1, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.
- **Sep 22, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 22, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, and Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Sep 22, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Europe, Energy, the Environment and Cyber.
