Simplify Timelines and Assure Regulatory Transparency Act or the START Act

This bill sets forth a variety of provisions to expedite the environmental review of energy projects.

## Actions Timeline

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- **Oct 28, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **Sep 23, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.
- **Sep 23, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment and Climate Change.
- **Sep 22, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 22, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, Transportation and Infrastructure, and Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
