Summary (as of Oct 14, 2022)

Range Access Act

This bill directs the Departments of Agriculture and of the Interior to identify suitable locations for, and construct, shooting ranges on National Forest System land and public land administered by the Bureau of Land Management, respectively, for the public to use for recreational target shooting.

Such shooting ranges may not charge a fee to use the range.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 28, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **Oct 14, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 14, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
