Summary (as of Nov 17, 2022)

Increasing Access to Lung Cancer Screening Act

This bill provides for coverage without prior authorization requirements of annual lung cancer screenings under Medicaid, Medicare, and private health insurance for individuals for whom screenings are recommended under U.S. Preventive Services Task Force guidelines. It also expands Medicaid coverage of counseling and pharmacotherapy for cessation of tobacco use to all individuals, rather than only pregnant women.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 1, 2022:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H8677)
- **Nov 18, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Nov 17, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 17, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
