Summary (as of Dec 14, 2022)

Close Agency Loopholes to the Jones Act

This bill eliminates several administrative exemptions to, and interpretations of, the Jones Act as enforced by U.S. Customs and Border Protection. The Jones Act requires that vessels transporting cargo domestically must be U.S.-built and generally owned and crewed by U.S. citizens.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 15, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation.
- **Dec 14, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 14, 2022:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E1293)
- **Dec 14, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Rules, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
