Taking Action to Prevent Suicide Act or the TAPS Act

This bill requires U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) and the Department of Health and Human Services to jointly establish a task force to develop recommendations for a comprehensive policy to prevent suicide by CBP personnel. The Department of Homeland Security must develop a plan based on the task force's assessments and recommendations.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 15, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border Security, Facilitation, and Operations.
- **Dec 14, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 14, 2022:** Referred to the House Committee on Homeland Security.
