National Windstorm Impact Reduction Program Reauthorization Act of 2022

This bill reauthorizes the National Windstorm Impact Reduction Program through FY2027, directs the program to develop and implement new standards to make housing and infrastructure more resilient, and requires a study of the impacts of climate change on windstorms.

Further, the bill encourages the implementation of cost-effective mitigation measures to reduce the loss of life and property from windstorms through a coordinated federal effort, in cooperation with other levels of government, academia, scientific organizations, and the private sector.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 16, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management.
- **Dec 15, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 15, 2022:** Referred to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
