Summary (as of Dec 22, 2022)

Protect Against Terrorist Threats (PATT) Act of 2022

This bill expands, for immigration purposes, the definition of *engaging in terrorist activity* to include threatening, attempting, or conspiring to take certain acts considered to be terrorist activity under current law, such as gathering information on potential targets for terrorist activity.

Currently, non-U.S. nationals (*aliens* under federal law) who engage in terrorist activity are barred from admission into the United States.
