### Summary (as of Jan 10, 2023)

This resolution establishes in the House of Representatives the Select Committee on the Strategic Competition Between the United States and the Chinese Communist Party, which is comprised of not more than 16 Members appointed by the Speaker (7 of whom shall be appointed in consultation with the minority leader).

The resolution authorizes the committee to investigate and submit policy recommendations concerning the status of the economic, technological, and security progress of the Chinese Communist Party and its competition with the United States.

## Actions Timeline

- **Jan 10, 2023:** Considered under the provisions of rule H. Res. 5. (consideration: CR H121-129)
- **Jan 10, 2023:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 11.
- **Jan 10, 2023:** The previous question was ordered pursuant to the rule.
- **Jan 10, 2023:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 11, the Chair put the question on agreeing to the resolution and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on agreeing to the resolution until a time to be announced.
- **Jan 10, 2023:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H143-144)
- **Jan 10, 2023:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 365 - 65 (Roll no. 26). (text: CR H121-122)
