Energy Security Cooperation with Allied Partners in Europe Act of 2023

This bill establishes requirements related to U.S. international energy strategy.

Applications to export natural gas to North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) member countries, Japan, and certain other countries must be granted on an expedited basis without modification or delay.

The President must impose sanctions on a person (individual or entity) that provides certain equipment, investment, or services to the Russian government or related entities for constructing or servicing Russian energy export pipelines.

The Department of State must report to Congress on a strategy to enhance the energy security of NATO member countries and increase exports of U.S. energy (and related technologies and services) to such countries.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 10, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy, Climate and Grid Security.
- **Feb 28, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 28, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, Financial Services, Oversight and Accountability, Ways and Means, and the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
