## Summary (as of Feb 28, 2023)

### Protecting Gun Rights and Due Process Act

This bill establishes a framework to generally require mental health records of states and certain federal agencies to be issued in accordance with procedural requirements (e.g., after a hearing) and meet certain criteria if they are used to disqualify individuals from receiving or possessing firearms under federal firearms laws.

## **Actions Timeline**

---

- **Mar 10, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Innovation, Data, and Commerce.
- **Feb 28, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 28, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Appropriations, Veterans' Affairs, Ways and Means, and Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
