## **Targeting Child Predators Act of 2023**

This bill revises the processes and procedures related to nondisclosure requirements issued in connection with certain administrative subpoenas.

The bill modifies the process for issuing a nondisclosure requirement in a child exploitation or abuse investigation and lengthens the period of time during which a recipient of an administrative subpoena is prohibited from disclosure.

It also subjects a nondisclosure requirement to judicial review, requires the administrative subpoena to include notice of the availability of judicial review, and establishes a process for judicial review.
