Determination of NEPA Adequacy Streamlining Act

This bill requires the Department of the Interior and the National Forest Service to use previously completed environmental assessments and environmental impact statements to satisfy requirements under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 if the agency determines that a new proposed action and its effects are substantially the same as a previously analyzed proposed action and its effects.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 25, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Forestry.
- **Mar 7, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 7, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
