Summary (as of Mar 9, 2023)

Pipeline Sabotage and Accident Prevention Act

This bill establishes criminal penalties for causing a defect in or disrupting the operation of pipeline infrastructure.

Specifically, the bill prohibits a person from knowingly and willfully

- causing or threatening to cause a defect in a pipe, pump, or valve intended to be used in any pipeline facility that would affect the integrity or safe operation of the facility; or
- disrupting the operation of a pipeline facility.

Violators are subject to a fine, a prison term of up to 10 years, or both.

- **Mar 17, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy, Climate and Grid Security.
- **Mar 17, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Mar 10, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines, and Hazardous Materials.
- **Mar 9, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 9, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, and the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
