Summary (as of May 11, 2023)

Rural Hospital Cybersecurity Enhancement Act

This bill requires the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) to develop and annually report to Congress about a workforce development strategy to address the unmet need for cybersecurity professionals in rural hospitals.

Additionally, CISA must disseminate materials that rural hospitals may use to train staff about cybersecurity.

Actions Timeline

- **May 9, 2024:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Reported by Senator Peters with an amendment in the nature of a substitute. With written report No. 118-170.
- **May 9, 2024:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 381.
- **Jun 14, 2023:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Ordered to be reported with an amendment in the nature of a substitute favorably.
- **May 11, 2023:** Introduced in Senate
- **May 11, 2023:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
