Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 347) to require the Executive Office of the President to provide an inflation estimate with respect to Executive orders with a significant effect on the annual gross budget, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 30) providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Labor relating to "Prudence and Loyalty in Selecting Plan Investments and Exercising Shareholder Rights".

This resolution sets forth the rule for consideration of

- H.R. 347 (Reduce Exacerbated Inflation Negatively Impacting the Nation Act, which requires the Office of Management and Budget and the President's Council of Economic Advisors to provide an inflation estimate for each executive order that is projected to cause an annual gross budgetary or economic effect of at least \$1 million), and
- H.J. Res 30 (nullifies a Department of Labor rule that permits fiduciaries of employee benefit plans to consider climate change and other environmental, social, and governance factors in investment decisions or when exercising shareholder rights).

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 28, 2023:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H924-930)
- **Feb 28, 2023:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 166.
- **Feb 28, 2023:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 166, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until a time to be announced.
- **Feb 28, 2023:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H931-932)
- **Feb 28, 2023:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 213 - 201 (Roll no. 122).
- **Feb 28, 2023:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 216 - 205 (Roll No. 123). (text: CR H924)
- **Feb 28, 2023:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 216 - 205 (Roll No. 123). (text: CR H924)
