Justice for Exploited Children Act of 2023

This bill replaces the current maximum civil penalty of \$11,000 for a violation of the child labor laws with a minimum civil penalty of \$5,000 and a maximum of \$132,270 (or, in the case of a violation that causes death or serious injury, \$25,000 and \$601,150, respectively).
