Summary (as of Jan 11, 2023)

DHS Cybersecurity On-the-Job Training and Employment Apprentice Program Act

This bill requires the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to establish a DHS Cybersecurity On-the-Job Training and Employment Apprentice Program to identify and train DHS employees for cybersecurity work.

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency within DHS must lead the program. Among other things, the agency must (1) track the status of cybersecurity positions at DHS, (2) develop a program curriculum, and (3) recruit DHS employees for the program.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 8, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Protection.
- **Jan 11, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 11, 2023:** Referred to the House Committee on Homeland Security.
