Summary (as of Apr 27, 2023)

Women in Criminal Justice Reform Act

This bill establishes programs and requirements to address the health and wellness of women in the criminal justice system. For example, the bill requires the Bureau of Prisons to (1) ensure that all incarcerated women have access to basic standards of health care specific to their needs, and (2) develop and implement gender-responsive training for its officers and employees.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 17, 2024:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Apr 28, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Apr 27, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 27, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Ways and Means, and Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
