Summary (as of May 11, 2023)

Diagnostic Lab Testing Transparency Act

This bill requires providers of clinical diagnostic laboratory tests under Medicare to publicly post certain information relating to the prices of services.

Specifically, providers must post and annually update information about the discounted cash price and the minimum and maximum negotiated rates of each test, including ancillary services. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services may assess civil penalties for violations.

- **Dec 17, 2024:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **May 12, 2023:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **May 11, 2023:** Introduced in House
- **May 11, 2023:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
